**Pupil Premium Rationale**

Pupil Premium funding is used to continue to strive to ensure that every disadvantaged child achieves their full potential and makes at least expected progress. Pupils are eligible for Pupil Premium support if they qualify for free school meals, if they have previously been in the care of the local authority, or if they have a parent in the armed services. They receive pupil premium if they have met any of this criteria over the last six years. Any children currently in the care of the local authority would be eligible for Pupil Premium Plus support.

At Beaupré Community Primary School around half the pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) are also disadvantaged pupils who are eligible for pupil premium funding. Therefore a proportion of our expenditure is allocated to support and interventions from teaching assistants and our specialist Pupil Premium practitioner for disadvantaged pupils with SEND. Additionally, Pupil premium interventions are used to support all disadvantaged pupils, including the most able, to ensure they achieve their full potential.

In 2015-16, attendance for disadvantaged pupils (95.29%) was slightly lower than whole school figures (96.11%), even though the gap has narrowed since the previous year. Additionally there was a higher proportion of lates from children receiving Pupil Premium support in comparison with the whole school. Therefore, Pupil Premium funding is used to provide free breakfast club places for disadvantaged pupils, to provide an opportunity to arrive in good time, and have breakfast.

To ensure fair access to the wider curriculum, pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium are provided with free transport to swimming lessons, free educational visits and, from Year 3, access to free music tuition with our instrumental teacher. A free school jumper is also provided upon request by the parent, to ensure children feel ready to learn.

The school evaluates the impact of Pupil Premium spending at the end of every year.

FREE Music Tuition on request for Key Stage 2 children meeting pupil Premium criteria.	Children supported by Pupil Premium have opportunities to develop musical instrumental skills.
FREE Beaupré School jumper available upon request for children meeting pupil Premium criteria.	Those pupils requiring support with school uniform feel ready for learning.
