Sports Premium Funding 2013-14

Our allocation of Sports Premium funding is £8605. The Government's guidance about how to spend this money, which will be paid for two years only is as follows:

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and Sport, with the discretion of how this is achieved with the Headteacher and Governors

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and encouraging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers of professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools

Use of funding at Beaupré Community Primary School

- to support the cost of specialist sports teachers to work with Years 1 - 6 (1 afternoon per week each class). To develop support staff in aspects of and quality of Physical Education for these children to enable us to enhance the provision of Physical Education across the school.
- to buy in specialist sports teachers to run three after school Multi skills clubs for; Foundation and Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3, Year 4. To introduce and encourage participation in extra curricular activity in sports and physical development.
- to enable the school to run an after school Football club providing training and skills and participate in a football league playing matches against other schools, for year 5 and 6 pupils
- to buy in an additional swimming coach to teach swimming groups for all groups from Reception to Year 6 to support and enhance our existing commitment to this sport

Impact of Sports Premium Funding

Ofsted report 2014 - The extra government funding to promote sport and physical education in primary schools has been used effectively to provide extra opportunities for pupils. All classes from year 1 upwards enjoy a full afternoon of physical activities each week, taught by a specialist coach. These coaches also provide training for support staff so they can continue to help pupils in the future. The range of extra sports activities has been greatly increased, and now includes pupils from all classes.
